Voter Services (Voter Education) Committee

This is the League's year-round efforts to help citizens become informed voters, including organizing candidate forums and a salad supper with local candidates.

Communications Committee

This committee manages social media communications and public/member outreach.

Voter Registration and Outreach Committee

This collective is our year-round efforts in registering voters and providing voting information.

Membership and Welcome Committee

The "welcome wagon" orients new members, and connects interests with actions and resources.

Advocacy and Action Committee

Local League members act on current LWV positions and principles through testimony, letters, phone calls, coalitions, community outreach, and media campaigns.

Educational Programming Committee

Designed to involve the membership and citizens through local priorities fostered by opportunity in currents events and the community.

Youth/Student Projects

Fosters healthy connections between LWVB and Bloomington schools, and advises committees and the Board of Directors on relevant matters and scholarship awards.

What is the member's place within the LWV?

Every member is a member of all three levels of LWV: national, state, and local. Members work on local issues in the community through the local League; act on problems of state government through the state League; and work on national governmental issues through the national League. If LWV Minnesota or a local league is part of an Inter-League Organization (ILO), a member could also work on the county level, a river basin, or a multistate metropolitan region depending on the geographic area represented by the ILO.

What kinds of activities are available for individual members?

There are many opportunities for individual League members to learn about the LWV, participate in its deliberations and express personal points of view:

- Committees in the League can be local, state, or national and they offer members the opportunity to work on a League activity or to study an issue.
- Members can also work on state League committees like communications, membership, budget, nominations, voter service, inclusion, or action.
- Workshops/Trainings/Forums are open to all members. They can focus on a policy area, assist members in various leadership roles, or both.
- Meetings offer an opportunity for wide discussion and exchange of ideas; and allow the board to inform members of its plans and actions, to receive suggestions, vote on issues, and socialize.

Who is eligible for membership in the League of Women Voters?

Anyone who wants to become informed about issues and actively participate in the democratic process may join the League. Voting League members are at least 16 years of age. *Men are welcome and we do have male members.*

What do I receive for paying my dues?

When you pay your dues, you become a member of the national, state, and local Leagues. League membership offers you unlimited opportunities to make a difference, become a leader, and develop skills speaking in public, interviewing, organizing, event planning, and writing. It is also a way to form friendships and build professional networks based upon mutual enthusiasm and concerns. Perhaps the most valuable benefit is becoming a better-informed and more effective citizen!

Dues are collected each year; dues for members and friends are as follows:

- Individual \$ 75.00
- Household \$ 110.00
- Student \$ 13.50
- Financial Hardship \$ 13.50 (for questions, contact the LWVB President)
